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ASSAM'S BIHU DANCE CREATES HISTORY, ENTERS GUINNESS BOOK OF WORLD RECORDS




The largest Bihu dance has 11,298 participants and was achieved by State of Assam (India) in Guwahati, Assam, India on 14 April 2023.

Bihu is an ancient harvesting festival celebrated in the state of Assam, India. It is celebrated with food, gatherings, dance, and music. People adorn traditional attires like Dhoti, Gamocha and Chadar, Mekhala. According to Assamese history, the first ever Bihu dance performance was done in 1694 when the Ahom king Rudra Singha (1696-1714) invited Bihu dancers on the special occasion of Rongali Bihu.

During Magh Bihu folks make an out-house, stay one night, have a grand feast and in the very next morning they burn it down.

Make a hut using waste paper, dry leaves and sticks.

Mekhela Chadar woven with silk is indigenous to Brahmaputra Valley in Assam. Sericulture in Assam comprises of the mulberry (locally known as Pat) and nonmulberry silks. The latter include Eri and Muga, which are of indigenous origin.



'GAMOCHA' GETS GI TAG

'Gamocha', a symbol of the culture and identity of Assam, has received the Geographical Indication (GI) tag The 'gamocha', a handwoven rectangular cotton piece of cloth with red borders and different designs and motifs, is traditionally offered to elders and guests as a mark of respect and honour by Assamese people.

Sattriya is a 600 year old dance form that originated from the Vaishnavite monasteries of Assam. in year 2000 Sattriya Nritya was recognized as the eight major Indian classical dance forms.

For decades the dance was kept within the gates of monasteries as a sacrifice to Krishna and until recently, women had little access to it. The dance is now performed by all genders.

THE TRADITION OF CHEWING BETEL NUT AND PAAN

If one visits an Assamese home, the first thing to be offered, even before water, is a green leaf and a nut, served in a bell metal utensil. The green leaf is a betel leaf called paan and the nut is the areca nut called Tamul.



200 YEARS SINCE THE DISCOVERY OF TEA IN ASSAM BY BRUCE

In 1823, Robert Bruce discovered wild tea plants growing wild in the upper Brahmaputra Valley. Subsequently, a tea garden was started by the government in 1833 in the erstwhile Lakhimpur district. Assam contributes over 50% of total tea produced by India.



In Assam two types of metal crafts are available – bell metal and brass metal. Traditional utensils and ornate articles crafted from these metals adorn every Assamese household. For centuries, the Xorai and bota have been cherished, serving as vessels to present betel-nut and paan to esteemed guests upon their arrival.

Other interesting crafts include masks made of wood, terracotta, or metal, as well as jewelry, wood craft and traditional paintings.





Cane and bamboo are deeply entrenched in the fabric of Assamese life. Consequently, a plethora of household articles in Assamese homes аге crafted from these versatile materials. The Jappi, a traditional sunshade, stands out as the most esteemed bamboo creation in the state.



Pottery

From traditional cooking intricately to pots designed earthenware. pottery in Assam showcases the craftsmanship and artistic expression of its creators. This ancient craft not only serves practical purposes but also preserves the rich cultural identity of the Assamese people.

<u>Jolpaan</u>



In Assamese, "Jolpaan" means breakfast, a light snack eaten between meals. It includes rice varieties like bora saul, chira, kumol saul, pithaguri, xaandoh, muri served with cream, curd, or jaggery.

Masor Tenga



Masor Tenga is a sour and tangy fish curry using ingredients like lemon, mangosteen, or tomato for flavor.

<u>Baanhgajor Lagor</u> Kukura

served with cream, curd, or jaggery. An authentic food of Assam, this dish uses chicken, bamboo shoots and lentils in its preparation, using minimal spies.





Aloo pitika is the Assamese version of mashed potatoes, flavored with raw onions, mustard oil, and green chilies. It is a popular dish in the northeastern state, often enhanced with cilantro, pumpkins, boiled eggs, and dried fish for added taste.



<u>Khar</u>



Khar is a key element in Assamese cuisine, made from burnt banana stem or peel ashes. It is used in various dishes with ingredients like raw banana and lentils. Known for its stomachcleansing properties, it is integral to Assamese culture, with locals often referred to as 'Khar Khuwa Asomiya'.
