

Telangana region has been ruled by great dynasties such as Sathavahanas, Kakatiyas, Chalukyas, Mughals, Qutubshahis, Asafjahis. Kakathiyas contributions to architecture are considered most impressive while Sathavahanas ruled Telangana region for about 400 years right from the 2nd century B.C. to beyond the 2nd century A.D. Among Kakathiyas, Prataparudra, was a great ruler who ruled till A.D.1323.

Festivals OF TELANGANA



Various Festivities.

Telangana hosts a diverse array of festivals reflecting its cultural richness. Bathukamma, a unique part of the Dasara festivities, is celebrated by Hindu women in September/October, venerating Bathukamma, the goddess of womanhood, also known as Maha Gauri Devi. Bonalu, another Hindu festival in June/July, honors Goddess Maa Kali with feasts that include offerings of goat or chicken meat and alcohol as sacred gestures of thanksgiving. The main Muslim festival, Ramzan, and the widely celebrated Moharram, known as 'peerla panduga,' draw active participation from Hindus as well, showcasing the region's religious harmony.

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








TRIBAL DANCE








Telangana boasts a vibrant tapestry of traditional dances, including the ancient Perini Thandavam performed exclusively by male dancers, traditionally executed by warriors before Lord Shiva's idol prior to battle during the Kakatiya reign. Rooted in devotion to Lord Shiva, Perini Thandavam incorporates the concept of 'Prerana,' signifying inspiration. Other celebrated Telangana dances include Gusadi Dance, Kuchipudi, Tribal Dhimsa Dance, and Lambadi Dance. Burra Katha, originating from Tandana Katha, features three main artists in the center and highlights moral values traced back to Sidhenra Yogi.

Telangana is renowned for its exceptional weaving and dyeing techniques, owing to its globally acclaimed cotton production. Women in the region commonly adorn sarees, langa voni, salwar kameez, and churidar. Notable Telangana sarees include the Pochampally Saree and Gadwal Saree. Bhoodan Pochampally, a Mandal in Nalgonda District, is renowned for its Ikat-style sarees and fabrics, characterized by the distinctive tie and dye weave known as Pochampally weave.








Art of Telangana






